Rep. Curcio Not Seeking Re-Election

Rep. Michael Curcio (R-Dickson) will not seek re-election for his District 69 seat, per a social media announcement yesterday. After six years of service as a state representative, Curcio said the following about his departure:

"With your support, we have accomplished more in the General Assembly than I could have imagined, and I want to thank all of those who believed in me and supported me through this journey," Curcio said.

The following current House and Senate members will also not seek re-election this year:

Sen London Lamar left her House seat in March to temporarily fill the vacant District 33 Senate seat, for which she is likely to seek election.

We expect to see more announcements before the April 7 filing deadline date.

General Legislative Updates

April 13 was the legislature's expected adjournment target, but it now seems a couple of weeks will be added to that. Word in the hallways at the Cordell Hull Building suggests that the likely extension is due to the Governor's education funding formula change.
